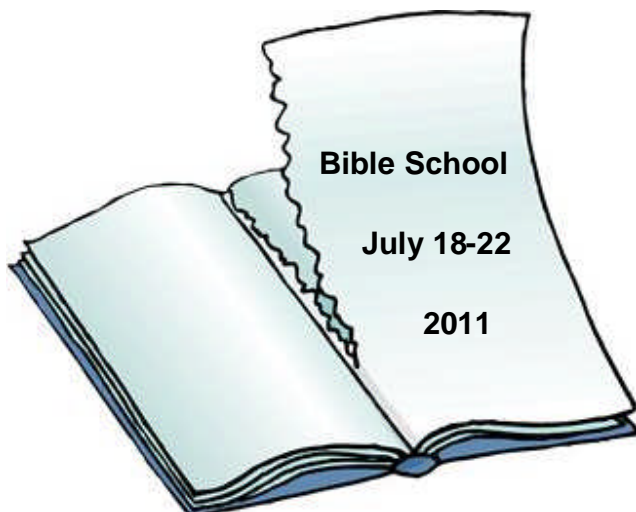
## What's happening at the Emanuel Children's Home?

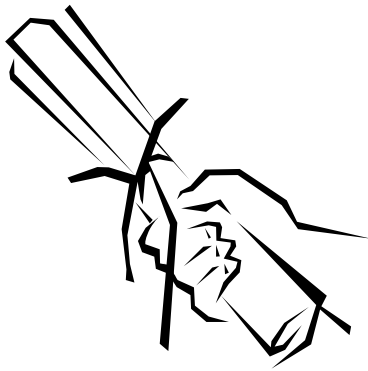

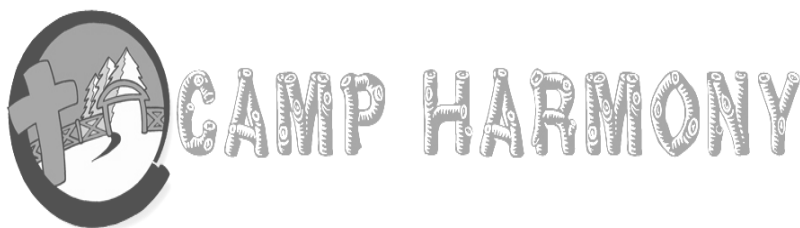

# Field Report from Asia

Dear friend and supporter,

I thank you for your prayer and financial support for your missionary and the Lord's work in the South Kerala Region. Your prayers make a great difference. We are thankful to you for standing with us for the extension of His kingdom in the unreached areas of this region. May the Lord continue to bless you richly!

Pastor Anil is serving the Lord in this region and goes for regular outreach ministry to remote villages. During one such outreach, he met Suseela, who was distraught due to problems in her family. Suseela is from a poor Hindu family and her husband is a taxi driver. They borrowed money for the marriage of their second daughter and were struggling to pay it back. Also, their daughter was expecting and the doctors said that the baby was not normal. All this made the family sink into deep sorrow.

When Pastor Anil shared the Gospel with Suseela, she expressed her desire to know more about Jesus, as there was no peace or happiness in her life. The pastor encouraged Suseela from the Word of God and prayed for her. Realizing the greatness of Jesus, Suseela began to believe in Him. Pastor Anil often visited the family and prayed for them. The Lord honored these prayers and gradually they were able to clear all their debts. Also their daughter delivered a healthy baby. Experiencing the goodness of God, Suseela and her family committed their lives to Jesus.

I am delighted to write to you that many souls have been added to the Body of Christ through our radio broadcasts. One among them is Sajan. Sajan had been suffering from some kind of allergy for a long time. Day by day his health deteriorated and his whole body became red. Sajan underwent many medications, but all his efforts were futile.

Sajan's wife Sally is a regular listener of our radio broadcast. In the midst of this crisis, she contacted us by phone asking for prayer. Our missionary prayed for the healing of Sajan over the phone. The Lord honored this prayer and healed Sajan completely. Through this miracle Sajan's family learned that Jesus is the living God and received Him as their personal Savior.

The Lord is also using our Women's Fellowship teams effectively for the extension of His kingdom. These are groups of sisters within the local church who focus on outreach to the community. As a result of their ministry Rajeev and his family came to Christ. Rajeev was from a Hindu family. He was the only breadwinner of the family. But he spent all his hard-earned money on drinking alcohol, and would never take care of his family. He used to fight with his wife about petty matters after drinking alcohol. He would also fight with his neighbors for no reason. Because of his misbehavior nobody liked him and everyone was scared of him.

During outreach, our Women's Fellowship sisters visited Rajeev's family and shared the Gospel with them. They also prayed for them. Through their continuous witnessing and prayers, Rajeev left his habit of drinking and began to take care of the family. Also, he and his family decided to follow Christ.

Also, our team distributed food packets to beggars on the streets. These people were very happy, and many expressed their thanks with tears. These initiatives helped us to reach the neglected ones of the society with the love of Jesus Christ.

Recently we organized an Evangelistic Meeting in this region. Around 8,000 people, including both believers and non-believers, gathered from different places and were blessed.
