DEACON MINISTRY

What scares you these days? The monster under the bed is a memory for most of us; no worries there. As the world continues to spin, seemingly out of control, a quick look at the newspaper headlines or a few brief moments of radio or tv news can easily have you at your wits end, to say nothing of what we see on social media. You may have noticed that we are a nation divided, which is not new; one needs only to study history. But for many of us, division of this depth – there is only right or wrong and no middle ground, there is no truth, only "my truth", and if we don't agree we cannot be friends or even be polite to one another, and division of this breadth – everything is up for grabs, from your political beliefs to what you can and cannot say, or think about the price of rice in China, is unprecedented. Does this level of division concern you? It very likely does, at least on some level. But why? Why is it unsettling? Do you ever ask yourself this question? Maybe it is because this nation, founded on the preservation of religious freedoms and Christian beliefs, may be faltering, wobbling at the knees a bit. And maybe it is because it is being pulled apart in the name of many things, religion being one of them.

Or maybe we are intentionally being used for someone else's gain. Maybe this distraction, this "bright shiny object over there", away from the cross, is meant to plant that seed of doubt in your mind. And maybe that seed of doubt sprouts and takes root, and before you know it, your hope lies in some thing or some person. Someone steps in and promises to make everything better, and we are told that our hope lies somewhere **other than** in the cross. Maybe it's a product that looks great and it sounds great and it will make you happy and it is yours for just 3 easy payments of \$39.95, BUT WAIT! There's more! If you act now...... And on and on it goes, and we take it in, and we are ridiculed, even shamed if we don't like it, or if we speak against it, or if we don't scoop it up in mass quantities. You are made to feel like a lesser person, and that leaves one feeling alone, desperate, different, hopeless.

For the believer, maybe the feeling of fear is an indication that we have taken our eyes off the cross and the significance of Christ's death there. Scripture tells us in 2nd Timothy 1:7 that "God does not give us the spirit of fear". Deuteronomy 31:6 tells us that we are to "be strong and courageous" and later tells us that God "promises to be with us and that He will never leave us or forsake us". I recently heard tell of a poor, "phoneless" fool, who sat by a stream, perhaps at the base of a waterfall, doing nothing, completely unaware of how afraid he is supposed to be. Maybe we are too connected to all that goes on around us, and maybe, just maybe, that prevents us from drawing close to God and hearing that small still voice. Maybe things are not falling apart, but falling into place. (See 2nd Timothy 3 for details.) After all, a greater prize awaits us, eternity spent with our Creator, who loves us beyond measure. It might be time for us to look inward instead of looking at all that is happening around us. We will find hope and peace there. As Matthew 11:28 tells us, "Come to me all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

A friend once told me that generals and peacemakers both need the same thing – conflict. Only Satan would argue that the world needs more conflict. Is he happily at work watching us being pulled apart and doing all he can to create more chaos? To be sure, he is. He is benefitting from all of his hard work day by day. Remember, John 10 reminds us that he "comes to kill, steal, and destroy". See this for what it is. But know that the world needs the Gospel message now more than ever. Are you wondering what you should be doing amidst the chaos? See Matthew 28:19-20 for your job description. And chill a little.... God remains on the throne. May His peace be upon us all!

Proyecto Aldea Global Ongoing Emergency

Relief and Reconstruction in Honduras

Proyecto Aldea Global (Project Global Village) was overwhelmed with emergency relief activities amidst the COVID-19 pandemic and the two destructive hurricanes in 2020. Throughout these events God's love and faithfulness could be seen through every one of the partners who came alongside PAG to aid the most destitute families across Honduras. They are sincerely thankful for you, their dear friends, for the ongoing and generous support. Their relief program involves the construction of houses, the rehabilitation of community water systems, road repair work, and on-going food provisions and medical care to families affected. The following is a summary of their activities.

House Reconstruction - Several thousands of farm families in western Honduras have lost their houses as well as their crops, after the storms of last year. In coordination with the municipalities, PAG has begun the reconstruction of houses and the beneficiary families contribute with hand labor and the local materials.

Rehabilitation of Community Water Systems - PAG's staff has evaluated the damages in 50 water systems that supply water to the rural communities in western Honduras. Together with the contribution from municipalities and labor from each local community, all 50 community water systems will be repaired to supply more than 4,000 families with clean water. Many truckloads of pipe are being shipped to Honduras (as pipes are no longer being manufactured in the country) to repair essential community water systems.

Road Repairs - PAG works in mountainous rural areas where crops are grown and where farm to market roads are extremely important for commerce. These roads are the lifeline for many rural communities to have access to health services as well. PAG has opened several hundred kilometers of roads, especially in western Honduras, and now are helping to repair them to restore transportation of crops from the fields to the markets.

Food Distribution - Thanks to their generous partners, Gleaning for the Hungry, PAG received containers of dehydrated vegetables and oatmeal for the families living in provisional shelters and those affected by the two hurricanes in Honduras. This storable food is perfect for the emergencies since it only requires preparation on site to feed hungry families. The staff from the community health program in central Honduras distributes these bags and teaches local families how to prepare delicious and nutritious recipes with them.

Medical Brigades- PAG's community health program in central Honduras continues to provide medical care to hundreds of families living in remote communities in central Honduras with the support of three medical doctors, two professional nurses, two dentists, and PAG's own network of health volunteers.
