DE&CON MINISTRY

...Serving the Maple Spring Congregation

Some thoughts regarding Covid and returning to normal church activities.

There are church people who are now vaccinated. Many of the people who are vaccinated may want to get back to normal church activities.: of course they do, and of course they should, but let's be careful about how that happens.

There might be ways to do that, but we need to really ask ourselves if "let's just go back to normal church activities for the vaccinated people" is the way to do it, or "worship for the vaccinated."

And what about the Pastor and Secretary. Is our custodial staff vaccinated? Are our Organist, Pianist, Sunday School Teachers and Ushers? Also, it is none of our business if someone on our church staff has a medical condition that makes them particularly at risk for Covid complications. And it's none of our business if they have a medical condition that makes it unwise for them to get a vaccine. Don't force that question with them. This is why we need herd immunity through vaccination: to protect those among us who have legit reasons not to be vaccinated.

Please do not start rushing back to normal church activities like this was all about you.

Also, if we put a "only vaccinated people can attend" policy into place, I want us to take a step back and think about what that says: to people who are having a hard time working the system to get their vaccine; to people who cannot, for medical reasons, get the vaccine; to children, who are not yet eligible for the vaccine. And, are we really asking our pastor and church leaders to check people's vaccination card at the door?

Our church staff and leaders has been working HARD this year. But please be kind to these people who have been working so hard to figure out how to be the Church right now. If we think we want to be back at normal church activities, our church staff and leaders REALLY wants to be back to normal. Church is what they do.

And finally, please sit quietly with yourself, and do a little deep breathing, a little self check. Our society has been through a trauma. Individuals have been through a trauma. We've had relatively little opportunity to process it. Sometimes, when we've experienced something like this, and had to bottle it up, it comes bursting out in ways we aren't expecting.

Our church leaders are kind, helpful people, and they can be easy targets for our bottled up pain and frustration. Please be gentle to our leaders; and please listen to them as they try to do their job, which is to be a shepherd. A good shepherd sets boundaries, keeps the flock safe, and leads them into greener pastures. But there are sometimes rocks and places of danger along the way. Please trust that church leaders are looking out for the whole flock. We'll get to that good, green grass soon.

Sisters in Christ Women's Ministry

The Sisters in Christ Women's Ministry is a fulfillment of a vision from God. In 2002, a core team of five women built the Women's Ministry on a foundation grounded on God's word. "It is a precious cornerstone that is safe to build on. Whoever believes need never be shaken." (Isaiah 28:16b). Their first event was held September 11, 2003.

Sisters in Christ Women's Ministry is a Christ centered support group, where women meet for prayer, praise, encouragement, fellowship, and worship of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. They offer hands to hold, shoulders to cry on, and knees to join in prayer; but most importantly to study God's word and to help each other cope with the problems and trials of this world. Their speakers are Christian women speaking on spiritual topics.

The mission of the Sisters in Christ Women's Ministry is to encourage women in their faith walk, to become Sisters in Christ and to share Jesus' love with one another. They strive to minister to the spiritual needs of the women of our church and community, to reach out and share Jesus with women who do not know him, and to encourage and build each other up in their faith.

They provide a Sunday School class each Sunday at 9:30 a.m. for women of all ages to grow and disciple one another. They also periodically hold Bible studies.
